We have been using the Wand for local anesthesia in our oral and maxillofacial surgery practice for about four years. Oral surgeons typically are not known for their gentle injection techniques as we are often in a hurry to get things going. Although we thought our technique was pretty good, we noticed a huge difference in our patients' responses to the level of comfort they were experiencing during injections with the Wand. We have many comments like, "Wow! I wish my dentist had one of these!" and, "Did you give me an injection? Are you sure it was a needle? I didn't feel anything!" Needless to say, the word is out that getting local anesthesia in our practice is a very comfortable experience. We are able to do surgery on cooperative children with nitrous oxide and local with the Wand. They don't even bat an eye! I firmly believe that the Wand has removed one of the major obstacles to dental care. Everyone's biggest fear is the fear of the local anesthetic injection or that they won't be numb enough. We find that the use of the Wand really reduces these concerns.
